CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

This self-paced, introductory course explores the process of "tracing your roots", by researching family descendants and ancestors. Students will discuss and construct family trees, ancestor charts, and family group sheets. The use and methods of print and non-print resources will be covered. This course is repeatable.

Upon successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

1. List reasons regarding the importance of finding out more about their family's descendants.
 2. Use genealogy "terminology".
 3. Identify and utilize several research resources to locate names of ancestors and descendants.
 4. Use the Internet to locate family members.
 5. Use "Family Tree Maker" and "Personal Ancestry Files" software on the computer.
 6. Construct a family tree of five plus generations.

- C. Research Methods (Print and non-print)
 1. National - Census Records, Soundex & Miracode, Vital Records, Libraries, Genealogy Centers, Obituaries, Newspapers, Journals, Cemetery Records, Land Records and Grants, Military Records.
 2. Local - Historical and genealogical societies, city Directories, county histories, maps, and newspapers.
