 - d. Braiding
 - e. Trims and fringe
 - f. Ribbon work
 - g. Embroidery, including freehand sewing machine techniques and hand sewn
 - h. Liquid embroidery and paint embroidery
 - i. Couching/Cording
- 5. Incorporate fabric, threads, wool, varn and stitching to create unique pieces.
- 6. Fabric manipulation including texture and color, i.e. Chenille.
- 7. Transferring design techniques.
- 8. Tools and equipment used to decorate garments.
- 9. Utilizing recyclables and ready to wear clothing for embellishment.
