Upon successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

- 2. Students will demonstrate knowledge of a variety of appropriate guidance techniques in response to children's needs. Students will clearly identify examples of inappropriate guidance techniques.
- 3. Students will demonstrate an understanding of cultural influences on child behavior, family, and individual practices.
- 4. Students will describe several ways to show respect for family/child culture in early childhood classroom or home setting.
- 5. Students will describe the importance of play, and will be able to describe the value of at least 2-3 play activities for children.
- 6. Students will identify at least 4-5 community resources (in their own area) that may assist families in caring appropriately for children
- 7. Students will describe the role of the early childhood teacher/child care provider in providing a safe, healthy environment.
- 8. Student will be able to describe the importance of maintaining a team relationship with families.
- 9. Students will define professionalism and describe at least 2-3 actions that demonstrate a commitment to professionalism.
- 10. Students will be able to describe the role of the child care agency licenser and will be able to provide at least 10 examples of child care licensing standards.
