Each answer to the essay questions is worth up to 25 points for a total of 100 points. Applicants will be evaluated on the Ideas, Voice, Word Choice, and Punctuation/Grammar. This year, applicants who meet the minimum requirements will also participate in an interview the week of March 12th. The **nine (9)** applicants with the highest overall score will be notified no later than **Friday, March 16, 2018**.

Following the Spring Tour, attendees will be required to present a short 15-minute presentation to the Student Success & Support/Student Equity Committee. Details will be discussed at a later date.
