STUDENTS, PLEASE STAY HOME IF...

Please do not come to campus if you or someone you have come in close contact with tests positive for COVID-19, or if you exhibit these symptoms:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Symptoms may take 2 to 14 days after exposure to the virus to appear.

OUR COMMITMENT TO STUDENTS

Taking care of our students is at the center of everything we do, and as the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to impact our communities, we want you to know we have taken the following steps to ensure your safety on campus:

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

HANDS:

Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for 20 seconds, rinse and dry well. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

SOCIAL DISTANCING:

Maintain six (6) feet distance between yourself and anyone in the classroom or campus. When someone coughs or sneezes, they spray small respiratory droplets from their nose or mouth, which may contain the virus. If you are too close, you can inhale the droplets, including the COVID-19 virus if the person coughing is infected.

MASKS:

The CDC recommends that people wear cloth face coverings in public settings and when around people who don't live in your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

PPE:

Each student will be issued a PPE Kit that includes: disposable masks, PVC Pirate gaiter mask. hand sanitizer, disposable wipes, and a germ-free pen.

Additional masks will be available, when needed.
