EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BUILDING TRADES

The Program Review Committee met and reviewed the Building and Construction Technology two-year update on May 7, 2013.

We have accepted the report, with the following findings:

- The report adequately describes the purpose of the program, which is to provide students with skills necessary for working in construction vocations.
- Data shows there is consistent demand for people trained in this area.
- Program meets students' needs as evidenced by degree and certificate completions.
- Program contributes to and benefits from external issues including facilitating the needs of secondary students and construction of solar plants near Blythe, providing local job opportunities.
- FTES income adequately covers expenditures.
- 2-year program goals have been identified and include developing correspondence courses and new curriculum.

PART 6: TWO – YEAR PLAN

During the 2010-2012 academic year, the BCT faculty updated course outlines for the Masonry and Cabinet programs. All other courses have had their Learning Student Outcome added to the new template.

BCT faculty and staff will continue to work with the counseling department to ensure all students will receive matriculation service and have education plans that will reflect their individual goals. These contacts should increase degrees and certificates for the next two years.

The Photovoltaic course had a 16 student enrollment and had numerous inquiries for future classes. Our solar program will continue to grow in the next two years.

BCT correspondence courses are being developed. This will help increase the FTE's from the prison population.

BCT is in the process of purchasing granite tools and equipment for our new masonry program. Money to purchase these stations will come from VTEA funding designated for course improvement and curriculum development.
