What changes have been made to the program:	No value
Program Justification:	Currently Palo Verde College only offers a Hazardous Material, Haz Mat, Degree requiring 60 units. Haz Mat is only one of several areas within the fire service. Having an education is Haz Mat is definitely beneficial for the fire service, but does not cover all areas of the fire service required for a well-rounded fire fighter, company officer or chief officer. As a Fire Chief I cannot hire an individual with just Haz Mat training as that would be a disservice to the people of the community we serve. The requirements within this Fire Science Chief Officer Certificate program will not only meet, but exceed the expectations needed to develop an individual to be successful as a Chief Officer in the fire service. The addition of the Fire Science Chief Officer will allow students to achieve a Fire Science Chief Officer Certificate as well. The hope is the student will continue their education and achieve an AS.
